

## Year 11: Macbeth (recovery)

What are we learning about?

Morality and society through Shakespeare's play.

You will learn to analyse Shakespeare's language and structural features of his writing, giving reasons for his craft including the social and historical context of the play.



Why are we learning about it?

This was taught remotely in the summer term of Year 10. As part of the recovery curriculum we are developing and building on existing skills; this includes analytical skills and being able to comment on the relevance of a Shakespearian text in the modern world.



What new **KNOWLEDGE** will I gain?

You will gain a deeper cultural understanding of Jacobean and Elizabethan England, the supernatural and human nature including ambition and conscience. You will also learn about Shakespeare's style and writing devices.



How does this build on the **SKILLS** I already have?

You have already analysed language and structural features in a novella and a collection of poems. You have some knowledge about the Shakespearean era from other texts studied including KS3. You will also learn how to interpret and meet the demands of the exam question.



What new **SKILLS** will I develop?

You will develop your analytical skills by exploring language and structural devices, leading to a secure evaluation of the impact of these on the reader.



How does this build on the **KNOWLEDGE** I already have?

You already have some knowledge of the themes, events and characters in the play. You will connect ideas from previous learning to build on this.
