ENGLISH: Year 9 Spring Half Term 1 – Romeo and Juliet

What are we learning about?

In this topic, we will be learning about how Shakespeare explores morality and society through the play. You will learn to analyse Shakespeare's language and structural features of his writing, giving reasons for his craft, including the social-historical context of the play.



Why are we learning about it?

Shakespeare is considered to be one of Britain's greatest writers. We will explore a text from the Elizabethan era written to entertain an Elizabethan audience.

New knowledge will include what life was like the Elizabethan era, particularly for women. You will learn about the tragedy genre and its conventions. You will also learn more complex terminology to help you with analysing Shakespeare's language.
