RAS: Year 11 Spring Learning Journey 1: How does religion affect the world today?

What are we learning about?

We are going to consider how religion (predominantly Christianity & Islam) affects life today. We'll track the changing impact over time to see how in 2023, art and architecture, medicine and freedom can be affected by religion.



Why are we learning about it?

Too often people say 'I'm not religious, I don't need to know that.' It is so important to see how religion can have a lasting impact on society, even in Britain where now only 46% of people say they are Christian, and consider the wider world.



What new **KNOWLEDGE** will I gain?

- Religion's impact on art and architecture, focused on the UK and Southern Spain;
- Christianity & Islam's impact on medicine over time;
- How religion can affect freedom

For GCSE RS students, it'll build on your core knowledge of religion.
